

- 1. Only horses and ponies competing will be allowed onto the Show ground.
- 2. All entrants must hold Public Liability Insurance.
- 3. All horses and ponies must have an up to date flu vaccination
- Correct headgear and suitable footwear must be worn at all times when mounted. A hard hat must be worn by everyone leading a horse on the show field.
- 5. No horses (without allocated entry number) to enter any of the practice or competition rings.
- 6. The judge's decision is final.
- 7. Entry fees are not refundable.
- 8. The organizers reserve the right to refuse entry without any reason being given and if necessary to alter or cancel any classes at anytime.
- All horses/ponies must be 4 years old or over to compete in ridden classes.
- 10. Any objections must be received in writing within 15 minutes of the conclusion of the class together with a £20 deposit, which will be refunded if the objection is upheld.
- 11. The organizers and landowners do not accept any responsibility or liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness to any person, animal or property whatsoever arising out of, or at this event.
- 12. All vehicles parked at owners' risk.

## SHOWDAY CHARITY Brecon Mountain Rescue Team



Brecon Mountain Rescue Team is a dedicated team of volunteers providing an emergency rescue service 24-hours a day, 365 days-a-year – saving the lives of those most in need, throughout mid Wales.

For more than 50 years, these dedicated volunteers have saved lives throughout mid Wales, not only on the mountains, but also in towns, rivers, and lakes across the region. We provide specialist search, medical, and rescue services, and work closely with the police, ambulance, and fire services when they receive a call for help, but are unable to find, reach or rescue those in need.

Brecon Mountain Rescue Team can access places that no other service can reach. As well as finding, treating, and rescuing walkers, climbers, fell-runners, mountain bikers and kayakers, they also assist the most vulnerable in our communities - people living with dementia, people who are depressed or suicidal, flood victims, and missing adults and children.

Television presenter, Kate Humble, who lives in the region, is the Team's Ambassador. Kate said: "The Brecon Mountain Rescue team receives no government or external funding. Its members give up their time on an entirely voluntary basis. Their dedication, professionalism and generosity has saved hundreds of lives over the years and never more so than in recent times. As someone who has spent many happy hours walking in and around the Brecon Beacons National Park, I am aware of what an enormous privilege it is to have a team such as this in the local area. The work they do for this community and its visitors is vital and invaluable".



- Brecon Mountain Rescue Team is an emergency service staffed by 60 volunteers and funded entirely by donations.
- Mountain rescue services are free to those in need because the teams are staffed by volunteers. However, equipment, vehicles and maintaining a headquarters all cost money, so those very same volunteers have to raise sufficient funds to maintain the service. It costs approximately £55,000 per annum to run the team.
- The team responds to around 120 call outs annually, with the peak season being April to September during the busy tourist season.
- The work of BMRT is not restricted to rescuing climbers and hill walkers; their skills are also deployed by the police to search for vulnerable or missing persons in the community.



## LIVESTOCK RULES AND GENERAL CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. The committee and landowners do not accept any responsibility or liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness to any person, animal or property whatsoever arising out of, or at this event.
- 2. Entry fees are not refundable.
- 3. The judge's decision is final.
- 4. Livestock exhibits must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least 3 months.
- 5. All livestock must be on the showground by 8:30am wherever possible.
- 6. No livestock to be removed from the field until 4:00pm, unless otherwise arranged *prior* to show day.
- 7. Whilst on the showground, the use of any substance containing toxic chemicals to prepare stock for showing is strictly forbidden.
- 8. The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry without any reason being given and if necessary to alter or cancel any classes at any time.
- 9. The committee reserves the right to change any judge as necessary on the day.
- 10. All prize winners to collect prize money and cups before leaving the showground otherwise prize money will be returned to the Show funds.
- 11. All cups to be returned clean and in good condition to section stewards by July 30th (or on the day by prior arrangement only).
- 12. All vehicles parked on the showground or in the car parks are at owners' risk.
- 13. All exhibitors to conform to all biosecurity measures and all vehicles and trailers to be in a clean state on entry to showground.
- 14. Do not muck out lorries/trailers anywhere on the showground.
- 15. Dogs must be kept on a lead and under control at all times. Please clean up after your dog.
